

Potters Bar U11 vs Cockfosters U11 on Wed 13th June

Cockfosters Won the toss and elected to bowl

For the Bar were the usual openers of Harrison Palmer and Luke McGee. Bar got off to another flying start, with them on 35 off 5 overs, then with the change of bowling attack, Luke McGee was bowled for 18 off 12 balls. This brought James Ilott to the crease. But by the 9th over Potters Bar were 66 for 3 with James Ilott out bowled for 11 and Bradley Ray out quickly. Harrison Palmer kept the Cockfosters bowling at bay with Freddie Scutt. After 13 overs Bar were 86 for 5 with Freddie Scutt out bowled and Will Navesey also bowled. Out came Tim Richards who smashed 4 fours in an over and with Harrison batting very maturity, bar raced to 109 off 15 overs. Harrison was eventually caught for a well deserved 40 in the 18th over. Tim Richards and Luke Jupp finished the innings off with some fine running. Bar had scored 140 for 6 off their 20 overs.

With rain pouring down during the break, Bar opened the bowling with James Ilott and Luke McGee, both of which bowled well with the wet ball but didnt manage to get a breakthrough. Luke Jupp, who is now becoming one of the consistent bowlers for the age group and Freddie Scutt were the first change bowlers and with that they brought 3 wickets between them, with Freddie picking up 2-8 off 3 overs and Luke Jupp 1-9 off 3 overs. Including a run out, Cockfosters were now 36 for 4 off 11 overs. Bar then finished off their remaining 9 overs with Hadley Caswell, Alex Dale and Lewis Taylor. The 3 boys and some fine wicket keeping by Harrison Palmer who took 4 stumpings, were too good for the Cockfosters batting. They were 56 for 9 off their 20 overs with Hadley's figures of 2-6, Alex 1-8 and Lewis 1-5.

Potters Bar now remain top by 2 wins and are well on course to reach the Middlesex Championships.
